# Mac's Meanderings

# 3 Ls: Light During Lent at the Labyrinth

arrived early at church Monday morning to get La head start on a long list of things I had to prepare for. I parked near the labyrinth, like I have done each day for the past several years, and quickly started walking towards the church door. I was a bit startled by a runner in his toboggan hat and yellow reflector vest as he ran down from Six Forks Road and straight into the labyrinth entrance. To my surprise his morning run included the labyrinth! I continued into the church building, as not to stare, but quickly went into the church kitchen to watch him through the window. He ran the whole labyrinth and then continued his run back on Six Forks Road.

# The poet Rilke writes, "There is nothing so wise as a circle."

Two Saturdays ago I was over at the church and again parked at the labyrinth. A bearded father holding his two year old daughter's hand was slowly walking with her through the turns of the

labyrinth. I could tell from where their car was parked that they had been playing at the playground and then had made their way over to the labyrinth. The father looked up at me with a big smile as I crossed the parking lot and he waved.

I waved backed

He then returned his

attention to his little girl

and their labyrinth walk.

On Ash Wednesday, I imposed ashes on the heads of a steady stream of 24 people from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. at the center of the labyrinth. As traffic whizzed by on Six Forks Road these folks had decided to change the frantic pace of culture with a slow, reflective walk on the labyrinth. One gentleman had walked to the labyrinth from his home to receive ashes — a walk of several miles to symbolize the beginning of

his lenten journey.

3:19... "From dust you
came and to dust you shall
return."

It is as you say daughter. Thanks be to God for lenten walks.


