

We will conduct our Offering of Letters with the assistance of Bread for the World, a non-profit organization which advocates for hunger relief through bipartisan legislation.

The Hunger Action Team will provide letter-writing supplies along with names and addresses of U.S. Senators and Representatives. Bread for the World will provide information about proposed legislation and sample letter language that we can incorporate. Our Offering of Letters will be dedicated to God just as we dedicate offerings of our funds and our service. Please plan to stay after worship on March 29th and participate in this Hunger Action event.




