She supervised the child care staff and child care wing, another area where upgrades have taken place. Her accessibility, compassion and kindness have been greatly appreciated as she made

Capital Campaign

Project Updates

Well, 2020 has not progressed the way any of us thought it would. The 60th Anniversary Capital Campaign projects may be the one exception. The design of the new Sanctuary access ramp was completed and the work was bid to several local construction companies.

We have entered into a contract with Riggs-Harrod Builders, Inc. to build the ramp addition as well as build a new section for the columbarium in Memorial Garden. The columbarium is funded through the Memorial Garden Funds and the ramp addition is funded mostly by the contributions to the Capital Campaign and partially by a designated gift to HMPC that the Session approved to be used for the

project. The design plans are with the City of Raleigh for permit approval and the contractor has started to ready the material orders. We are hopeful the permits will be issued in May and the construction will begin. If you come by the church in the next few months, please don't mind our mess in Memorial Garden, as the construction will be in full swing this summer.

The ramp will leave the north side Sanctuary vestibule, run along the exterior of the existing building past the Library, and enter into the John Knox room. That room will be converted into a gathering and welcoming area. New space is being created in Westminster Hall to handle our Sunday School class needs as well

as create a more flexible space with the addition of a partition wall.

and pledges of \$806,861. To date we have received \$610,838 against those pledges and look forward to the completion of the pledge donations to be able to complete the ramp project and finish funding the HMPC Foundation so we can continue to sustain the beautiful facility and grounds for years to come.

2020 is the third and final year of our 60th Anniversary Capital Campaign and projects. We continue to be blessed with the contributions of time, talent, and treasures by the congregation as we continue to fulfill the task force report vision to help us bring the word of God, through Jesus Christ, to our community. 
