# **Montreat Youth Conference**



# **Sunday Morning Programs**

#### 2019-20 Registration

Children's programs will resume next Sunday, September 8th. Parents and guardians of children enrolled in Sunday morning programs must complete a registration form. #### Pre-Elementary 9:30-10:20 am

#### Three's and Fours - Room 218

Children are invited to participate in faith based, age-appropriate songs and finger plays that introduce the Bible stories.

#### Joyful Noise 9:30-10:20 am

#### Grades K-4 – Geneva Hall/Music Room

Led by Gina Hayek. Children learn about Bible stories appropriate to their age and development using games and instruments. Children will have the opportunity to lead worship a few times a year through music and simple pageants.

#### Sunday School - 10:30-11:30 am

During worship children may participate in Sunday school education after the children's message. Before the service starts, make sure your child has been signed in at the back of the church in the narthex and has received a lanyard designating which age group they are in in order to leave with their leaders.

- Children ages 3–5 (Pre-Elementary)
- Children in grades 1–4 (Elementary)
- Children in grade 5 remain with parents

At the end of the service, children will return to the sanctuary and wait in a pew near the children's worship area to be checked out. These guidelines are for the safety of our children and to keep this process as easy and unobtrusive to the service as possible.

#### Children's Worship Area

Children (second grade and younger) who are not participating in Sunday school may utilize the children's worship area which is open following the children's message. Sit nearby and assist them as needed.

#### **Communion Sundays**

Children participating in the Sacrament can be checked out early from Sunday School or kept with parents in the Sanctuary.

A Communion Education Class is available following the worship service for children (ages 4 and up) and their parents.
