Following last week's article on Hunger Alleviation, the second topic of Development Assistance. As defined by PCUSA Hunger Action Committee Development Assistance addresses the root causes of hunger and poverty through equitable and sustainable development.

Food Insecurity is a result of many external factors. These include education, homelessness, domestic issues and economic inequalities. So, it's not just a matter of feeding those in need, we must also address the peripheral programs that help eliminate the root cause of food deficiency.
